EXECUTIVE MESSAGE



DETAILS ON ACCOMPLISHMENTS

CRISP INVOLVEMENT

In May 2016 One Tail at a Time created a program which would intercept at the front door of Chicago Animal Care and Control. We assembled a team of 8 rescues, shelters and animal welfare organizations and now operate three days a week outside our city shelter. The goal is to keep pets in their home, or to send them straight to a no-kill rescue group for adoption. In our first year of operation, **605 animals were kept out of the shelter!**

TWO SPECIAL CASE DOGS

1 *Daffodil* was surrendered by her family that could no longer care for her. As a puppy, the shelter would have been a dangerous place for her as she would have been exposed to a variety of deadly diseases. One Tail at a Time took Daffodil directly into our rescue and she was adopted the first day she was at our Adoption center!

2 *Chanel's* family was going to surrender her because they couldn't afford her costly parvo treatment. They were unaware that there was a vaccine to prevent parvo, and when their beloved puppy got sick, they brought her to the shelter thinking someone else could care for her. Instead of bringing Chanel into the shelter where she would have spread parvo and gotten sicker, we helped her family pay for her treatment, got her healthy, got her vaccinated and spayed, and kept her with the family she loves.






ABOUT US


OUR TEAM

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW




OPERATING REVENUES AND SUPPORT SERVICES
